

The following vital programs are made possible by the Runaway and Homeless Youth Act (RHYA):

STREET OUTREACH PROGRAM (SOP)

provides education, prevention, treatment, counseling, connection and referrals to services to prevent sexual abuse & human trafficking for youth at-risk of experiencing trafficking and homelesssness

BASIC CENTER PROGRAM (BCP)

provides temporary housing with, counseling, therapeutic family intervention, connection to education, and supportive services for minors experiencing homelessness

TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM (TLP)

provides longerterm housing with supportive services for youth 16 to 22 years of age, including Maternity Group Homes for pregnant and parenting youth

NATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM

24/7 national phone, text, & online communications systems which connects youth and families in crisis with prevention services and reunifies families

NATIONAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CENTER

provides training and technical assistance to all RHYA grantees



Runaway and Homeless Youth + Trafficking Prevention Act of 2023 (S.3125/H.R. 6041)

RHYTPA makes important updates to the current RHYA program:

- Includes new provisions to combat trafficking and prohibit discrimination
- Increases the length of stays in Basic Center Programs from 21 to 30+ days
- Increases grant award amount and overall program funding
- Increase allowable age for Transitional Living Programs to 25

- Creates new Prevention Services Programs
- Fixes the 20 bed per building issue in regulation
- Allows youth from other systems to be served by RHYA programs if the other system isn't housing them
- Assist youth in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)






